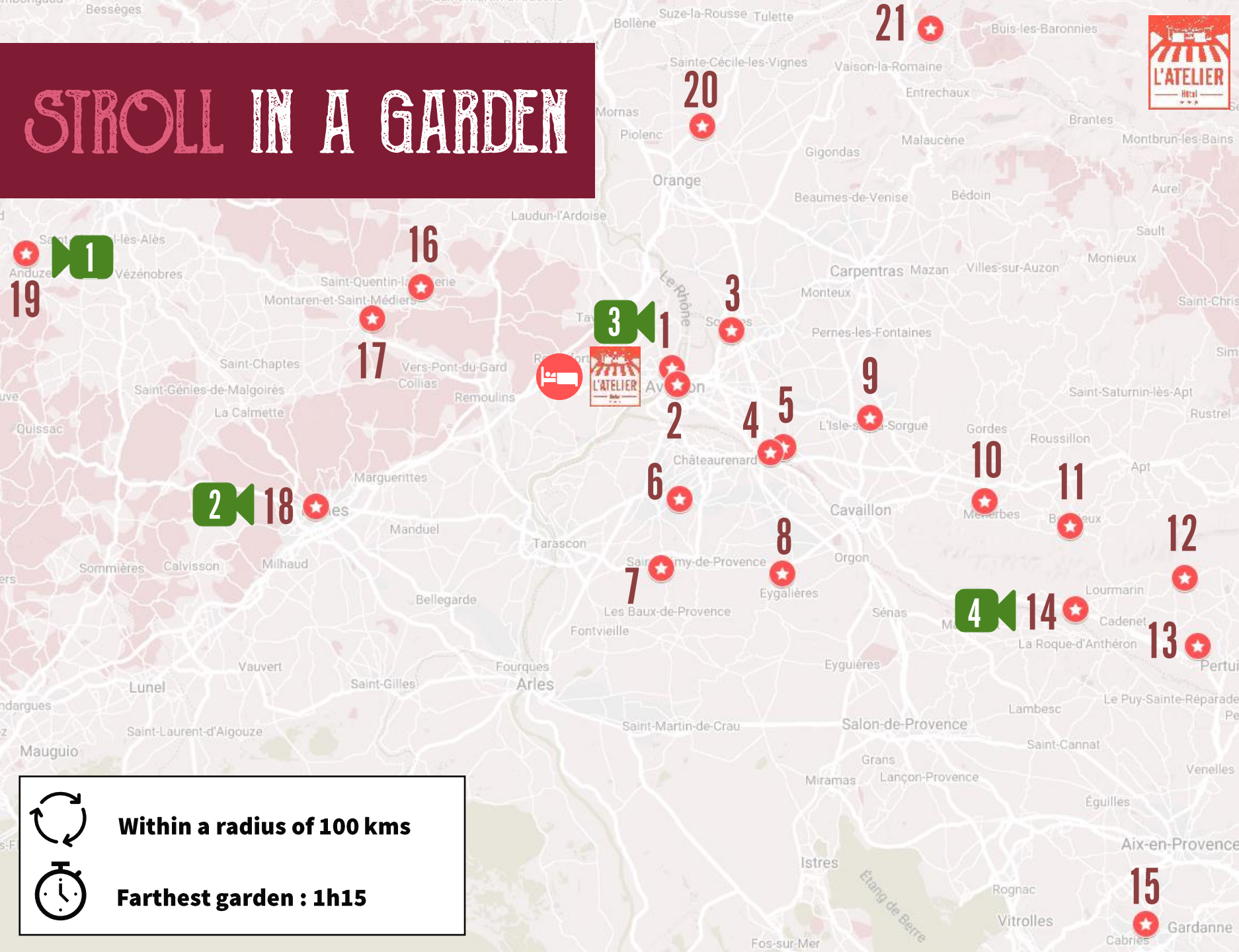

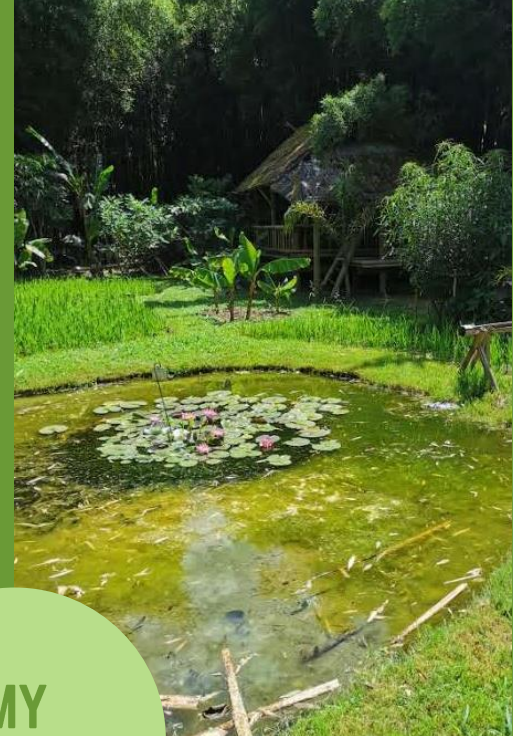


SEE OUR MAP

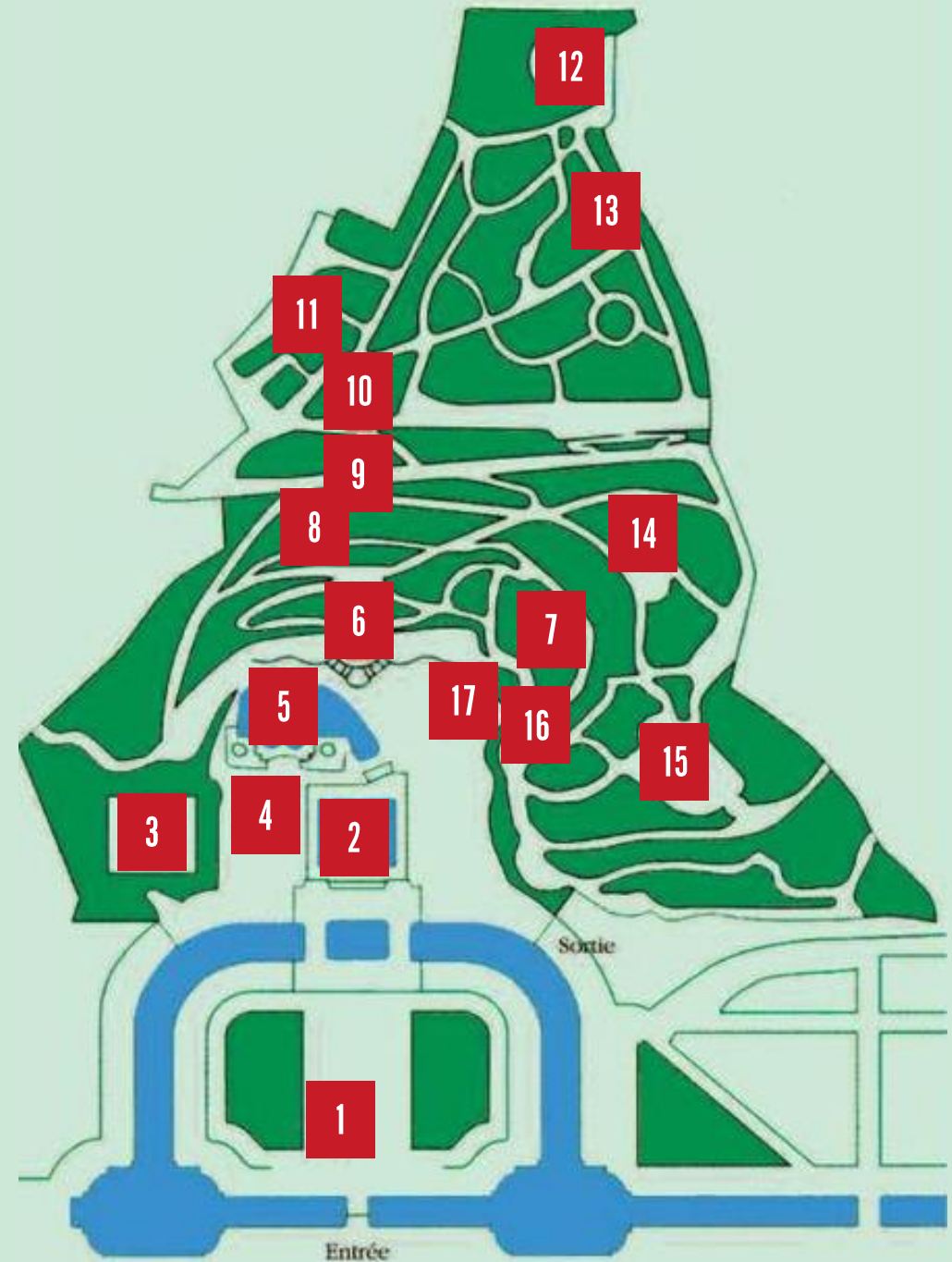

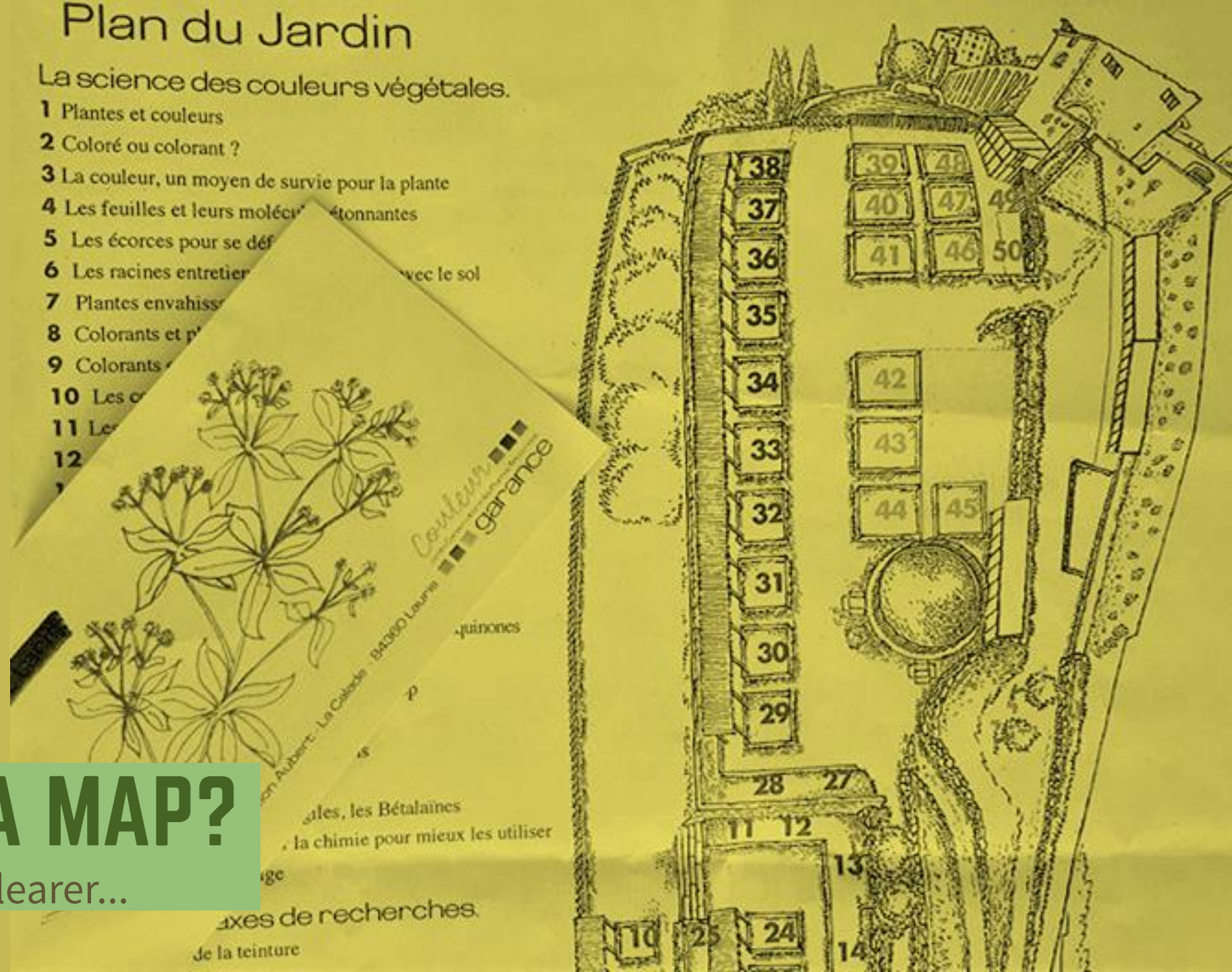
