



PREAMBLE HOW DID WE SELECT THE VINEYARDS?



You often ask us: "We would like to taste a good wine, where can we go? L'Atelier's team has mobilized and concocted 4 wine routes from the hotel (North, East, West and South). They are the fruit of a long "wine making", based on word of mouth, our experience, and especially, on our visits on the spot.

Châteauneuf-du-Pape is often the first ^{er}place you think of. You're right, it is one of the places you can't miss. Our goal is to show you that there are so many others. Within an hour's drive from L'Atelier, you have access to treasures!

To integrate our selection, we made sure that the domains met the following 3 criteria:

- A WISH TO WELCOME: Nothing worse than visiting a domain and not feeling welcomed. Problem solved, the domains present in this selection await you with open arms, at least with a free tasting in the cellar. Some even offer wine tourism activities, free or paid, to give you a great experience. Of course, all of this within the limits of the opening hours (Cf. Practical information at the end of the tour Attention, these are the Seasonal Hours).
- AN ENVIRONMENTAL APPROACH: The estate respects the earth and the health of its customers. Very often, it is in organic or biodynamic agriculture or has the label "HVE High Environmental Value".
- ❖ WINE QUALITY: We are not Parker! We have no desire to rate wines. We simply want you to discover wines whose quality is, in our opinion, indisputable. They are the references of their terroirs. After that, it's all a matter of taste...!

Beyond these purely objective criteria, the wine routes are above all a moment of emotion, an invitation to discover multiple territories and to meet beautiful people. During our tour, we were struck by the passion of the men and women who will welcome you. Many of these vineyards are real family adventures, sometimes started centuries ago, and where each generation proudly passes the baton. Their passion is communicative. It inspires. It questions. It moves. Isn't that the meaning of the journey...?






MY OPINION

Let's be honest! Few of you would ever think of going west of Avignon to discover vineyards. So this is perhaps the most useful wine route of the 4, if only to do justice to the great work of the winemakers. This is where you fill your cellar with good wines at reasonable prices.

It is also the route that will give you the feeling of crossing the most different "countries". All this in a short time. At the start of the route, the pretty and littleknown valley of Domazan will charm you. Then, head for the great terrace of the Costières de Nîmes, flat as far as the eye can see. Then, after having crossed the north of the Petite Camargue, you will continue with the restful valley of the Vidourle, authentic and preserved. You will feel the proximity of the Cevennes, and you will head towards the prestigious Duchy of Uzès, to finally reach the gates of the Cèze Valley, a hilly landscape, with a view of the Rhône and the Ventoux.






