


Preamble


Canoeing down the Cèze

in Goudargues A Z O A A A

Starting from the pretty village of Goudargues (known worldwide for its mirror canal in its centre), a little treasure awaits me: the descent of the Cèze valley in a canoe, with the well named company "Cèze Canoës". At the beginning, it starts normally, you take possession of your canoe, and a few useful explanations later, here I am on the Cèze river. And there, surprisingly, one is surprised to imagine going down the Amazon... Ok, probably with less crocodiles. But the rest is there. Immense trees plunging into the Cèze river, a jungle

sound atmosphere with omnipresent bird songs or noises (?), a jade green water colour. I forget everything and go on an adventure. An advantage: you can swim there without risk!

Control of La Capelle

Perhaps it is linked to my years spent in Canada, but in any case, this place magically took me back a few years, a few thousand kilometres from here. If you ask a local about the specificities of the Gard department, he will undoubtedly quickly talk about the scrubland. And yes, the Gard is above all the garrigue! It is thus all the more surprising to find this marshy place on our territory. It is moreover one of the only points of water in the Gard garrigues. The fauna has understood this, with no less than 155 species of birds present, including thirty or so very rare ones. The amphibians are not to be outdone. You have it understood, this place is unique and brings a "fresh" approach to our territory.

When I miss Canada, I now know where to go. 30 min. will be enough for me to go back...!





THE RUSSIAN STEPPES The Coussouls de Crau

La Crau is the other "flat country". A very particular place, situated between Alpilles and Camargue, left vacant by the displacement of the Durance river bed. It is flat, very flat, arid, with a horizon as far as the eye can see. One might think that there is nothing there! And yet 150 species of birds can be observed, and in particular the Ganga Cata (see photo), which you will not find in any other place in France. Dragonflies, crickets and lizards accompany them. It is also the privileged place of the sheep and the shepherds. Not forgetting the pebbles, once carried by the Durance. Beautiful paths await you at the start of the Ecomuseum of the Crau. I recommend the "Peau de Meau" trail (4.7 km), with its treasure hunt.



The Cedar Forest

At 1h10 from the Atelier, a landscape worthy of the Atlas awaits you. In 1861, visionaries planted

Atlas cedar seeds, at 720 m altitude, on the Petit Luberon massif. Well seen, the cedar is magical and reproduces very quickly. The forest quickly spreads over 250 hectares.

There are 4 easy walks starting from the site, one of which is accessible to all forms of disability. The place is a joy to behold! Ideal for families or lovers, on foot or by bike, in winter or in summer (the cedar tree keeps it cool). Picnics are highly recommended. Surprises await you, such as wooden huts to make your own during your visit or views of the splendid surrounding countryside.




Mont Ventoux

In 1 hour you reach the moon! The Mont Ventoux offers a unique lunar landscape, marked by its scree and the absence of vegetation. The repeated action of freezing and thawing has caused the limestone to burst into lava and has given rise to this spectacle. From a distance, it looks like it is always covered in snow. It is not so often. From the top of its 1910 m, the "Giant of Provence" puts the Earth at your feet, putting you in the position of privileged "observer-astronaut".

You are often close to the clouds, or even above them. At the top, nothing stands in your way. Everything is visible at 360°: the Alps, the immense Rhone Valley, Provence, the Camargue... In my opinion, without a doubt, the most beautiful view in our region. Going to Mont Ventoux is like living an experience beyond our limits... So, ready for the Apollo 18 mission?




The Ochres of Rustrel

8,000 km separate the Colorado of the Great American West and the Colorado of Provence, and yet everything brings them together: their shades of red, their canyon-like reliefs, their fairy chimneys, the often blue sky...

Of course, in Rustrel, the informed observer will notice the more present yellow ochres, the action of the hand of man, the Provençal vegetation appearing in the background, the "miniature" surface of the Colorado of Rustrel... But the resemblance remains all the same striking.

It takes about 2 hours to visit the place through nice well-marked and well-maintained paths. I like this place, again, for its change of scenery. And if that's not enough for you, play at being an Indian, by colouring your face. The Wild West will definitely not be far away!
