





Our Opinion








IDEA 3: THREE ASTONISHING MONUMENTS





3. La Chapelle de la Santonne: Roger Petit, another "madman" who came back alive from the Algerian War, wanted to thank fate and built this strange chapel. It's full of surprises: a tin roof, oddly curved stone walls, stained-glass windows depicting a fish, a wooden Christ, and so on.









Another unusual spot is the Grotte St-Marcel. As well as a highly recommended visit, you can enjoy a unique 3-hour experience, combining caving and wine tasting in the dark, with a cave guide and an oenologist. The cave is an ideal place for ageing wine, and houses 3,000 bottles 45 metres underground.

For those who want to avoid caving, it is also possible to combine a 1-hour guided tour with a 1-hour wine tasting session.




For several years now, Vol Terre has been organising hot-air balloon flights from Roussillon, in one of the most beautiful areas of Provence: the Luberon and its ochre.

It's a magical, Jules Verne experience, with a surprisingly smooth take-off (and landing). The flames lift the machine into the air and we reach an altitude of 1,000 metres. As someone who likes to get a bit of height, I'm in for a treat. You see everything better and from a different angle. The Colorado of Provence, the ochre of Roussillon, the most beautiful villages of the Luberon, and there are so many of them! It's all so beautiful. All your senses are stimulated (sight, smell).



Mehari, Coccinelle, 2CV, Combi van... You're spoilt for choice with Yes Provence. It's quite brilliant, you hire a legendary car, a deudeuche for example, and then you drive around the most beautiful places in Provence thanks to the agency's tailor-made tours. It's even now possible to combine your rental with an in-house treasure hunt, wine or cheese tasting, a stop at the swimming pool, and so on. In short, unusual all the way.




The Rocalinaud rock

TIP : DISCOVER
UNEXPECTED NATURAL SITES

The Rocalinaud rock is a strange rock with an enigmatic shape, also known as the "Moon Rock". It was formed by the sea when it covered Provence, creating the remains of an underwater dune. Since then, it has been inhabited by humans until the 16th century, creating small caves. There is a 2-hour, 4km walk (easy) to discover the site.

The Demoiselles coiffées site was also created by erosion, creating pretty fairy chimneys of ochre. An intimate site, easy to access (1h or 2h loops).



TIP 8: A WALK ON THE LAND OF A LOCAL LEGEND


Legend

This is the story of two brothers, and Anthony Erancis (Barberini), nephews of Pope Urban VIII. A bit of a rogue, they dabbled in alchemy, boasting that they could transform lead into gold and had found the elixir of life. The practice was totally banned and punishable by death, so the papal uncle sent them to a manor near Caromb (1647). At a sale that went against one of the brothers, the injured party took revenge and threw a vial in his brother's face. He was burnt and died. But his ghost drove his brother mad, and he in turn died of madness. Since then, we've been talking about haunted houses or Pre-Fantasti.

If I say seabed, Ansouis, fine art and the 16th century, what comes to mind? Nothing comes to mind. No wonder, only **Georges** Mazoyer thought that bringing these worlds together in one museum made sense. You'll find it in a 16th-century building in Ansouis (beautiful village). A keen scuba diver and student of the Beaux-Arts, he marries these two worlds perfectly through his zany, playful and dreamy collections. The highlight of the show is the passage through the blue grotto, with its blue stained-glass windows, plunging you into the Mediterranean abyss.
